DISCUSSION AND ACTIVITIES TO ACCOMPANY Chapters 6-8 of OVERBOARD

Information for Teachers and Caregivers:

Overboard is a story about three young people who must fight to survive both the elements and their relationships with each other.

Tanner's dad charters a boat in the Bahamas to bring together his two kids and the boy who is to become their stepbrother. But they are caught in a storm, the Sparta is damaged with Dad and the Skipper onboard, and the kids must survive on a life raft until help comes.

You might want to read the instructions with your learner. The "Things to Talk about" might be discussed with a caregiver, teacher or another student or written down. But relax on the spelling and conventions! The whole point is to get students understanding and thinking about their reading.

3. Why do you think Cory calls Tanner "Mr. Perfect" (page 46)? Is Tanner so perfect? Why or why not?

4. Which supplies on the life raft will be most important? Explain why.
